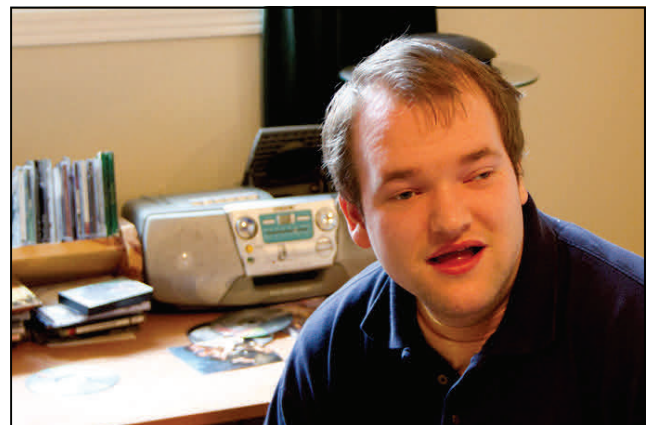
LIGHTS is a unique new program that will help individuals with an intellectual disability live in a place of their own, and to live lives they can call their own. A home of one's own is the first step towards a community of one's own, and towards real inclusion and authentic belonging.

2010 was a bold and magical year for LIGHTS. It was a year of creating infrastructure, goals and strategies, a year of opening the door to possibilities for families who have a son or daughter with an intellectual disability.

### ***But the year was much more eventful than anticipated!***

- The Advisory Board set an initial goal of raising \$3 million in LIGHTS' first two years: over \$1 million has already been raised.
- Since LIGHTS opened its doors, twenty families have been assessed and two families have been given funding.
- The Ministry of Community and Social Services generously agreed to fund two years salary to hire a Facilitator to manage LIGHTS' many components.

While the Advisory Board is thrilled with how far LIGHTS has come, it is the hands-on experience of building a future for these young men and women that really inspires the Board and everyone who donates. And for every dollar donated to LIGHTS, another 50 cents goes to the Fund thanks to founding patrons Mary Pat and Bob Armstrong's matching grant.
